Dr. Douglas Ray serves as the Deputy Director for Science and Technology at the Pacific Northwest National Laboratory and as the Associate Laboratory Director for the Fundamental & Computational Sciences Directorate. He is responsible for integrating the Laboratory's science and technology base to deliver essential scientific capability and accomplishments for meeting the nation's most critical challenges. Dr. Ray serves as the primary steward for research supported by the Department of Energy's Office of Science. He is responsible for directing more than 500 staff members in four research divisions: Atmospheric Sciences and Global Climate Change, Biological Sciences, Chemical & Materials Science, and Computational Sciences and Mathematics. Dr. Ray received his PhD in Chemistry from the University of California at Berkeley. He was a Postdoctoral Research Associate at the Joint Institute for Laboratory Astrophysics, Boulder, Colorado prior to joining PNNL as a Senior Research Scientist in 1990. He has served in a series of leadership positions in his career at the Laboratory.
