Depreciation of Facility & Equipment

- Depreciation mechanism
- Recovering depreciation
- Determining useful life of facility & equipment

Income Streams & Subsidies

- How do you promote the use of your facility to outside users?
- Do you have a separate rate structure for your outside users?
- Who funds your subsidy?
- Are federal funds received to help offset the fees for your users?

Start-up Companies

- Is there a separate fee structure for start-up companies?
- How do you determine what qualifies as a start-up?
- What is your process to recruit start-up companies to utilize your facility?

Equipment Funding

- How do you handle the purchases of equipment needed for the facility?
